HAPPY SPRING EVERYONE!

La Entrada at Rancho Viejo HOA had its first in-person annual meeting on February 15, 2024 at the Fire Station. It was good to see such a nice turnout of homeowners in vivo. Here is a recap and update on some of the issues discussed:

- Several people expressed concern that HOAMCO was unable to provide the year-end 12-month financials for review until the day of the meeting. Although it is not required that there be year-end statements for the annual meeting it does make sense to have them. The by-laws require the annual meeting to be within 90 days before or after the fiscal year end so in order to have the year-end numbers for the annual meeting we will move future annual meetings to the month of March. Having the annual meetings in February has not typically allowed for HOAMCO to receive the statements, the board to sign off on them, and then have them mailed at least 10 days before the annual meeting.
- Residents have observed an increase in speeding on Via Orilla Dorado, Via Punto Nuevo, and in some alleyways. While installation of speed bumps could slow down the speeders, it is not a cheap fix and it slows down emergency services (fire and ambulance) response time. We are surveying the alleys and streets to look at signage and discuss other solutions at the next board meeting.
- The ailing trees that were treated by TreeDoctor911 and Proscap last year appear to be healing and there are signs of budding on all trees. We will continue to monitor.

Reminder

Homeowners are responsible for snow removal not only on their properties but adjacent sidewalks. If you live elsewhere during winter months or have a work schedule or physical limitation that prevents you from clearing the sidewalks, there are commercial snow removal services you can hire.

New Housing Update

Cass Thompson, who represents the developer gave a brief update on construction activity in La Entrada and Peter Kempf added to the information. At this time the new area west of Caminito de las Rositas between Via Orilla Dorado and Calle Ancla has 35 lots and an undeveloped three-acre park area. Three houses have closed and only eight lots remain to be sold. The rest of the lots are in some phase of construction. It is expected that this area will be sold out in the near future. The undeveloped park has lagged in development due to the unavailability of a suitable landscaper but this problem may soon be resolved and development activity may begin this summer. Note: some people who drive through the active construction zones have reported an increase in nails and screws in their vehicle tires. It might be good to avoid driving in this area especially during framing and roofing work.

- La Entrada sub-phase 4 west of Avenue Corre Camino and before the fire station may begin grading activities this summer. This neighborhood will be a mix of regular and oversize lots.
- In May we should have a large dumpster return for oversize and excess trash removal. Dates to come.
- And lastly, please pay attention to articles from the Neighborhood Watch group about safety tips to decrease criminal activity and danger in the neighborhood. Dangers include the risk of unleashed dogs being walked. Elsewhere in Rancho Viejo, a resident was injured by a dog being walked off leash and they are looking for this owner to be responsible for the injuries suffered by the victim. Reminder: Santa Fe County can cite you for an unleashed dog and the HOA can fine you for it as well. Save your money and be respectful to your neighbors who have the right to use the sidewalks and trails unharmed.

9-1-1 Dispatch Sit-Along Opportunities

Have you ever called 9-1-1 or 505-428-3720 (the Santa Fe Sheriff non-emergency number)? Or have you ever wondered what is happening on the other end of the line when someone dials either of those numbers?

Whether dialed from home or from somewhere else in the city or county, all such calls go to the Santa Fe Regional Emergency Communications Center (SFRECC), which is located on Camino Justicia, off of Highway 14.

The SFRECC offers anyone who is at least 18 years old the opportunity to “sit along” at the SFRECC and observe emergency dispatch operations and the hard work that the dispatchers at the SFRECC perform. Occasionally, students who are 17 years old and who have parental consent are also allowed to sit-along.

The sit-along program is intended to be educational and to provide participants with a better understanding of the responsibilities of the dispatch professionals at the SFRECC. A sit-along session is usually a maximum of four hours long.

If you are interested in doing such a sit-along at the SFRECC, you will need to fill out a one-page application and agree to follow certain regulations. To request the sit-along application packet and to learn more about the program, please email Roberto J. Lujan, Director of the SFRECC, at rjlujan@santafecountynm.gov.



It's Your Call — For Safety

Here are a few easy ways to help promote and maintain safety for yourself and our area:

Report concerns to the Santa Fe Dispatch about anyone or any place where you observe a problem or have a concern. Reports can include suspicious behavior, request for a wellness check for an individual, information pertaining to a hazardous situation, or the like.

If you see something that seems a bit “off,” trust your intuition and call Santa Fe Dispatch. Doing so might save someone's life.

If you observe repeated behavior that is suspicious or otherwise problematic, you may request a “CLOSE WATCH”. aka extra Sheriff patrols for a specific address or street.

For all the above, call Dispatch at 505-428-3720 or if life threatening, call 9-1-1.

Protect Your Identity

Protecting your identify and your personal and financial well-being is so important. Win against the wind blowing papers and your data out of your trash can and onto big trouble, like early February when trash cans blew over. Our area can face strong winds any time of year.

To help minimize your risk of both ID theft and debris blowing around in our neighborhood, try this:

- Better shredding and bagging,
- Put heavier items toward the bottom of roll bins
- Place bins out in the morning.

Alerts may also include water advisories, road closures, power outages, evacuations, and lock down situations, etc.
